SØNDERBORG CASTLE – 800 YEARS OF HISTORY

Sønderborg Castle has been a royal fortress and aristocratic home for 800 years. The castle was built and extended several times over the centuries. You can see traces of many eras: cannon ball craters in the outer wall, the dungeon, the Renaissance castle chapel and the castle kitchens that once catered for parties in the Banqueting Hall. Follow the red route to learn the history of the castle as a medieval fortress, as dethroned King Christian II's prison and as the residence of Duke John the Younger, ancestor of the present Danish Royal family.

THE HISTORY OF THE BORDER REGION

Sønderborg Castle houses the region's largest historical museum. The green route tells the extraordinary history of the border region, where the Danish and German languages and cultures met – at times, a peaceful and profitable collaboration and at others a violent and painful dissent. In the newest exhibitions, you can immerse yourself in the history of Southern Jutland since reunification with Denmark in 1920. The main theme is the national history of the border region and local

tensions between German and Danish. The exhibition covers the Nazi era and German occupation of Denmark, but also successful reconciliation and cooperation between two cultures and two peoples.



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
